Hailed for her "virtuosic poise" and as "a dazzling piccolo virtuoso," **Jennifer Gunn** was appointed to the position of Piccolo of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra by Maestro Daniel Barenboim in 2005. Since joining the CSO, she has been active in many areas of the organization including the MusicNow Series, the Civic Orchestra of Chicago, the Dream Out Loud Music Education Advocacy Campaign, the Once Upon a Symphony series, CSO Chamber series, and has accompanied Maestro Muti on multiple occasions to the Chicago Juvenile Centers.

Equally at home on the flute or the piccolo, Jennifer has been featured as a soloist with the orchestra on many occasions. She made her flute solo debut under the direction of Ludovic Morlot on the orchestra's MusicNow series playing Shirish Korde's *Nesting Cranes* in 2007. One year later she made her piccolo debut under the direction of Harry Bicket playing Vivaldi's C Major Concerto RV443 on the CSO's subscription series. Jennifer has also been featured as a flutist on Bach's Brandeneburg Concerti with her CSO colleagues under the direction of both Nicholas Kraemer and Pinchas Zukerman. In March of 2019, Jennifer was featured as piccolo soloist under the direction of Music Director Maestro Muti playing Vivaldi's C Major Concerto RV444 and also played the CSO premiere of Ken Benshoof's Concerto in Three Movements for Piccolo and Orchestra.

Jennifer has enjoyed many occasions to join musician colleagues from the Chicago area and around the world. In the Chicagoland area, she has been a guest with the Bach Week, Dempster Pro Musica, Music of the Baroque, and the Civitas Ensemble. Outside of Chicago, Jennifer has enjoyed collaborating with musician friends at music festivals such as the Sunflower Music Festival in Topeka, KS, Buzzards Bay Music Festival in Marion, MA, Arizona Music Festival in Scottsdale,

AZ, and the St. Barth's Music Festival in St. Barthelemy, French West Indies. She can also be heard on recordings of music by composers Mason Bates, Anna Clyne, and Victoria Bond as well CSO orchestra recordings on the CSO Resound Label.

In demand as a clinician, Gunn has taught master classes around the world including a regular summer class at Orford Musique in Canada. She was a guest artist at the 2018 International Piccolo Festival in Grado, Italy. Gunn is a frequent guest at universities around the country teaching flute and piccolo masterclasses including classes at Carnegie Hall, University of Texas Butler School of Music, University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, University of Missouri- Kansas City, and Northwestern University. Jennifer has also been involved as an orchestral coach with the Civic Orchestra of Chicago, the National Youth Symphony (NYO), and the New World Symphony.

Jennifer has held previous orchestra positions including Assistant Principal Flute of the Louisville Orchestra, Principal Flute of the Fort Wayne Philharmonic, and Second Flute of the Wheeling Symphony. She holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the Mary Pappert School of Music at Duquesne University (PA), where she studied with Robert Langevin and Rhian Kenny. She had additional studies at the University of Akron (OH) with George Pope and Mary Kay Robinson.

Jennifer is married to Jonathan Gunn, Professor of Clarinet at University of Texas Butler School of Music.

Katherine Borst Jones, professor of flute at The Ohio State University since 1985, winner of both Distinguished Teacher and Distinguished Scholar Awards, is founder of the OSU High School Flute Workshop and the OSU Flute Troupe. A former forty yeer founding member and co-principal flutist of the ProMusica Chamber Orchestra and founder of the flute/viola/harp trio COSMOS, she is a former member of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra and current principal flute of the New Sousa Band, which has toured Japan, China and the US. She has served the National Flute Association as President twice and is the recipient of the 2011 National Service Award. She has recorded for CRI, d'Note and Summit recordings and has commissioned works by composers such as Libby Larsen, Stephen Paulus, Andrew Boysen, Dale Warland and Michael Ruszczynski.

Dianne Frazer is recognized globally as a premiere collaborative pianist. Known for her wit and style on and off stage, she "exudes an energy and an excitement that is both irresistible and endearing." She has performed with a "who's who" of international artists, and has performed in Weill Recital Hall in Carnegie Hall, Avery Fisher Hall, and Merkin Hall. According to Branford Marsalis, "Dianne is one bad-ass pianist!!" Dianne was on the faculty at Louisiana State University, is pianist for the National Flute Association, International Society of Bassists, World Bass Festival in Poland, the MTNA Southern Division, and has performed at the Oberstdorf Music Festival in Germany, ISI Florence in Italy, Bradetich International Double Bass Competition, International Hornists Society, International Trumpet Guild, North American Saxophone Alliance, and the International Clarinet Association conventions. Dianne holds two performance degrees, was a two-time Fischoff finalist, and was an adjudicator for the prestigious Dranoff International Two Piano Competition.

BIOGRAPHIES

Rose Bishop is Flute Instructor at St. Ambrose University, Coe, Cornell and Kirkwood Colleges. She is Principal Flute of the Southeast Iowa & Diversions, Founder of the Eastern Iowa Flute Workshop and a Trevor James Artist. Diversions, her solo debut album, was released in 2022. Kari Boyer is an advocate of contemporary music and private flute instructor based in Cincinnati, OH. Kari is a member of Emissary Quartet and has performed with the Waco, Montclair, Richmond, and Williamsburg Symphony Orchestras, and the Virginia Opera. She served as principal flutist of the 392nd Army Band in Richmond, VA. Kari earned an MM from Manhattan School of Music and a BM from Ohio State University. Primary teachers include Katherine Borst Jones, Michael Parloff, and Marianne Gedigian.

Lorien Britt is a sophomore at the Manhattan School of Music, where she studies with Linda Chesis. She was recently awarded first prize in the Colorado Flute Association Young Artist Competition and the Flute Society of Greater Philadelphia Collegiate Competition. Lorien plays on a Miyazawa Vision.

Diane Cattran, DC Grants LLC, has many years of experience helping non-profit arts organizations write grants and procure support to carry out their programs and achieve impact goals. Cattran works with a variety of arts organizations in central Ohio and is well versed in matching their needs to the available funding sources in corporate, foundation, and government

arenas. Clients have included the Jazz Arts Group, The Midland Theatre, Shadowbox Live, the McConnell Arts Center, and Momentum. She worked at Columbus Symphony, Opera Columbus, and CAPA as Director of Development for the Symphony and Opera. Prior to this, Cattran's 22-year career was at Battelle where she was instrumental in the proposal center, public information programs for U.S. Department of Energy contracts, and their corporate subscription program for workshops, publications, and consulting. She is also an accomplished musician and music educator -- her passion for the arts and arts education inspires her work in helping arts organizations thrive. She holds summa cum laude degrees in English Education and Music Education from Capital and OSU and a Masters in Educational Communications from OSU.

Wendell Dobbs has served as professor of flute in the School of Music at Marshall University for 39 years. He prepared his DMA at Catholic University while studying with Bernard Goldberg. After seven years in the United States Army Band, "Pershing's Own" he received a scholarship from the French Government which permitted him to study for two years in Paris with Michel Debost and Alain Marion. Dobbs performs as principal flutist with the Huntington Symphony and the Ohio Valley Symphony and performs with his colleague, guitarist Júlio Ribeiro Alves in the Violauta Duo. He is a John Deaver Drinko Academy fellow at Marshall University.

Rebecca Dorneich is a 13-year-old long-time musician. She started to learn piano at age of 4, Pipa at age of 8, and flute at age of 9. She won NY Flute Club Young Musicians Contest in 2022. She entered the finals of 2024 Gold Classical Music Awards for flute and Pipa. She will perform at Carnegie Hall in NYC in July 2024 as finalist.

Alyssa Eder is a Freshman at Tecumseh High School. She began playing flute at age 10 and studies with Melissa Mashner. Alyssa placed second in the 2022 SEMFA Rachel Stornant Junior Artist Competition. She has played as a member of the Michigan All-State Middle School Band and was a participant in the 2023 Bonita Boyd International Masterclass at Eastman.

Grace Farney is an accomplished flutist and educator from Lawrence, Kansas. Currently, Grace is pursuing a bachelor's degree in flute performance from the University of Kansas (KU) studying with Dr. Daniel Velasco. During her time at KU, Grace has performed in many different ensembles including the KU Wind Ensemble, KU Symphony Orchestra, KU Treble Choir, KU Chamber Choir, and the Rock Chalk Flutes.

Meagan Gaskill is a doctoral student in flute performance at The Ohio State University with a graduate certificate in college and university teaching. She is the flute Teaching Associate at OSU, conducts the Buckeye Flute Choir, and runs a private teaching studio. She performs with the Columbus-based quintet, Zephyr Winds, and is a substitute and freelance musician throughout Ohio. Meagan won the COFA Young Artist Competition in 2021 and currently serves as COFA president. Her primary teachers are Katherine Borst Jones, Jill Felber, and Dr. Jennifer Rhyne. She received an MA in Music Theory and an MM in Flute Performance from The Ohio State University and a BM in Flute Performance and a BS in Mathematics summa cum laude from Pacific Lutheran University.

Principal flutist of the Columbus Symphony from 1975 to 2018, **Randall Hester** graduated in 1973 from the Eastman School of Music with a Bachelor of Music degree in Flute Performance. From 1974 to 1981 he continued his studies with Maurice Sharp, long-time principal flutist with the Cleveland Orchestra, while concurrently holding the first full-time flute position with the CSO. Mr. Hester maintains a private flute teaching studio in Upper Arlington, OH.

Greta Hulterstrum is a BM flute performance major from MN studying at WVU. A few of Greta's recent accomplishments include performing at the 2023 NFA convention, performing in masterclasses with Jasmine Choi and Carol Wincenc, and winning First Prize in the World Stage Online Music Competition.

Lauren Jett is a student of Demarre McGill at the UC College-Conservatory of Music, and previously studied with Dr. Diane Boyd Schultz at the University of Alabama. Recently, she served as an administrational and teaching intern at the Virtual Flute Music Festival. She enjoys reading in her free time.

Kathy Karr is the Principal Flutist of the Louisville Orchestra and a member of the NouLou Chamber Players. For 25 years, she was the Flute Professor at the University of Louisville where she was awarded the University of Louisville's Distinguished Teaching Award. Kathy has also taught flute and chamber music at Interlochen Arts Camp and has performed recitals and masterclasses in Mexico, Israel and across the U.S.A. She is an Altus flutes Artist

Laura Lin was born in Taiwan in 2000 and began learning the flute at the age of seven. She won the First Prize at the New York International Competition and performed at Carnegie Hall in 2015. In 2016, she won the Second Prize at the Kaoshiung Students Music Contest, followed by the Excellence Award at the National Students Music Contest Finals in R.O.C. (Taiwan) in 2017. In 2020, she achieved First Prize at the Taichung Students Music Contest, and in 2021, she won First Prize again at the National Students Music Contest Finals in R.O.C. (Taiwan). She recently pursued a master's degree at the University of Iowa, studying under Professor Nicole Esposito.

Shannon Lotti is a second-year DMA student at Bowling Green State Univ. studying under Dr. Terri Sánchez. She is currently an active flute teacher as well as a solo and orchestral performer. MM - Univ. of Nebraska Lincoln; BM - Univ. of Texas at Arlington.

Noble Maendel is a homeschooled freshman from Homeworth and studies flute with Julie Sarver. She is also principal flute in the Canton Youth Symphony.

Dr. Kathleen Melago serves as Professor of Music Education at Slippery Rock University and head of the music education program. Kathy joined the faculty at SRU in August 2009, and teaches Music Education courses and supervises music student teachers and field students. Kathy received her Bachelor of Science in Music Education from Slippery Rock University, her Master of Music in flute performance from the University of Northern Iowa, and her Doctor of Musical Arts from The Ohio State University. She has taught music in Pennsylvania, Iowa, and Ohio, both in schools and privately.

SSG (Staff Sergeant) Karina Núñez-Hedrick, United States Army, currently serves as the Flute Instructor at the Army School of Music, in Little Creek, VA where her primary responsibility is to train new Soldier musicians following their 10-week Basic Combat Training. Karina has served in Army bands stationed in Texas, Virginia, and South Korea and received degrees from The Ohio State University (BM, BME) and the University of Memphis (MM).
